## Thomas daleske conviction in warren county

An Iowa prisoner allegedly killed Tuesday for the June 14 death of a fellow who is undergoing a 45-year prison sentence for sexually abused a child, according to the Department of Public Safety Iowa. Eric Hall, 44, was charged on charges of murder and still in custody at Fort Dodge Correctional Facility. According to IDPS, on June 14, a prisoner in Fort Dodge was found dead in his cell at 5:15 p.m. The cause of death was ruled to be strangled with a blunt force injury, according to the Iowa Daleske State Medical Examiner's Office is undergoing sentence for multiple counts of sexual abuse and extreme acts with a child from Warren County. He has been imprisoned since Oct 31, 2000. Investigators learned Hall had been inside Daleske's cell shortly before Daleske was found dead. In an interview, Hall acknowledged law enforcement that he killed Daleske. A criminal Warren County serving time at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility was reported dead by the Iowa Correctional Department Tuesday. Fifty-six-year-old Thomas Daleske has undergone a 45-year sentence on multiple charges of sexual abuse and extreme acts with a child, and was found dead inside his cell early Sunday morning. The Department of Corrections has asked the Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation to conduct an investigation, and the State Medical Examiner is conducting an autopsy to determine the cause of death, with all organizations working with Webster County Attorneys on any pending criminal charges. Daleske, who lives in rural Ackworth, is accused of raping at least eight boys in Warren County since 1986, working as a volunteer with the local Boy Scouts army. Copyright. A prisoner at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility has been charged with murdering Warren County criminal Thomas Daleske. According to the Iowa Department of Corrections, Daleske was found dead in his cell earlier this month, and the Webster County And Iowa DCI Medical Examiner determined the cause of death became strangulation and blunt force injuries to the head. After being investigated, it was determined that 44-year-old Eric Hall had been inside Daleske's cell shortly before the corpse was discovered, and while interviewing Hall admitted murder. Hall has been charged with First Degree Murder in Webster and remains in custody at Fort Dodge Correctional Facility. Daleske, who has lived in rural Ackworth, has undergone a 45-year sentence for multiple counts of sexual abuse and a deserted act with a child and accused of raping at least eight boys in Warren County since 1986, working as a volunteer with a local Boy Scout army. FORT DODGE - Thomas Andrew Daleske, aged 59, was found dead in his cell at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility on Sunday, June 14, 2020 about 5:15 p.m. At the request of the department, the Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) is leading an investigation into the death, and the State Medical Examiner is conducting an autopsy to determine the cause of death. DCI and JKM are cooperating with Webster County Lawyers on any pending criminal charges. Daleske has undergone a maximum sentence of 45 years for multiple charges related to Sexual Abuse and Lascivious Acts with a Child from Warren County. His inhibition began on 31 October 2000. When the death of a prisoner occurs, the department makes it a priority to inform both the families of the deceased and their criminal victims before releasing information to the public. ### FORT DODGE- The Iowa Department of Corrections reported that on June 14, Thomas Andrew Daleske, a prisoner at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility (FDCF) was found deceased in his cell at about 5:15 p.m. Daleske has undergone a 45-year sentence on multiple charges relating to Sexual Abuse and Lascivious Act with a Child from Warren County and has been jailed since October 31, 2000. The Iowa Criminal Investigation Division assisted the FDCF and Webster County Medical Examiners with the death investigation and determined that another prisoner, 44-year-old Eric Hall, had been inside Daleske's cell shortly before the remains were discovered. Hall was interviewed and included to kill Daleske. The Iowa State Medical Examiner's Office carried out an autopsy and determined the cause of Daleske's death became strangulated with blunt force injuries to the head and ruled the death of a homicide. On Tuesday, June 23 (Day Eric Hall allegedly killed Degree 1 in Webster County. He is still in custody at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility. Facilities. Facilities.
